The Tree Goats of Morocco

Wait, did I read that right – goats in trees? Well, yes, actually. I recently watched a show on world travel on Iowa Public Television about this very thing. It piqued my interest, so I did a bit more research and here is what I found.

Argania trees in Morocco are unattractive, but produce one of the world's most up and coming products. They

are thorny and rough with crooked branches. Strangely enough, goats love

to climb these branches and feast on the fruit.

Local farmers cultivate this practice, keeping the goats away until just the right time. And for what reason? Believe

it or not, it is for the POOP! Goats consume the fruit and poop out the seeds. These processed seeds become precious Argan oil. While Argan oil can be processed

without goats, it is much more time consuming and costly.

Argan oil is used in the USA mainly in the cosmetic field. It has moisturizing and nourishing properties, helping to reduce wrinkles, revitalize hair and aid in healing burns. In the Middle East, it is also consumed with bread.

Processing the oil is a hands-on process for women. They extract the seeds from the goat poop and grind it on stone to extract the oil. No wonder Argan oil is so expensive, but to many of us, very much worth it. Processing the oil provides these women a source of income for their families. It also provides them a bit of independence and feeling of self worth in a strongly male dominated society.



So really, who would have guessed that goat poop could be so valuable? Most of us just have too much around. Too bad we can't grow Argania trees in lowa...

Showing & Fitting Clinic 4-H & FFA Judge Training



2017 IDGA Showing & Fitting Clinic; 4-H & FFA Judge Training, held at Ma's Acres

On Saturday May 13 IDGA held a Showing & Fitting Clinic, which also included training for those interested in serving as a 4-H and FFA judge at county fairs, and a potluck lunch. The all-day clinic was hosted by Judi Nayeri of Ma's Acres dairy goats, at the family farm outside Bondurant, IA. Matthew Konen, Sima Nayeri, Mena Nayeri, and Butch Sowers led the instruction. The clinic was free and open to all.

Diverse aspects of the art of showing and fitting were covered, suitable for beginners just learning how to present

their goat in the ring, to subtleties of displaying the goat in their best light. Taryn Peffers attended the 2016 and 2017 clinics, and says, "I enjoy the showing and fitting clinic due to its friendly environment and the vast knowledge I learn. I come knowing nothing and leave with my brain full of information. Hands on learning also helps my brain process that information I learn." Matthew Konen, Sima Nayeri, and Mena Nayeri coached smaller groups on showing and then everyone came together with Butch Sowers for more showing practice and 4-H and FFA judge training. Mena Nayeri gave a tutorial on clipper maintenance and how to clip a goat, and Matthew Konen demonstrated hoof trimming.

The 4-H and FFA judge training was geared towards beginners as well as judges with an interest in improving what they can offer the youth of lowa in county fair show rings. There is a great need for educated dairy goat judges. Every year IDGA hears about the frustrating situation of having the dairy goats judged by people who have no background or training. This leads to not only strange decisions on ranking in the show ring, but also outright surprises such as a judge in a 2016 county show stating that the Nigerian Dwarf doeling being shown was not a dairy goat. IDGA wants to ensure that the youth of our state who are excited about showing their dairy goats are supported by judges who can give them valid input, and this clinic is one of IDGA's efforts to make that more and more likely to happen.

There is always something to learn, and new dairy-goat-minded friends to be made. "The showing and fitting clinic helped me at setting my goat up at Colfax" said Lainey Peffers who won Intermediate Showmanship at the Iowa Spring Classic. MILKING STARS

One of the problems for making sense of the abbreviations in goat pedigrees is the existence of more than one registry. There's the American production and the American Goat Society. Their symbols are sometimes the same, sometimes similar, and sometimes different. The ADGA is now the dominant player in the field, but older pedigrees will have a lot of AGS.

In cooperation with the Department of Agriculture, the ADGA and AGS have a way of helping us keep track of milk production: the Dairy Herd Improvement Register, or DHIR. To avoid producers putting their thumbs on the scale, disinterested parties do the measuring at least periodically. Monthly records are kept on total milk production, percent fat and percent protein, and recorded in the Advanced Registry, or AR. One can also do an observed one-day test, or do less stringently observed owner-sampler testing; the data from these tests is filed in a separate Star Registry, or ST.The * is awarded to does whose milk production, as recorded in the AR, exceeds a certain high level. This level is adjusted for the age of the doe and for

the breed (nobody expects a Nigerian dwarf to produce like an Alpine!). Also, a * can be awarded for volume of production, or for amount of butterfat produced, or for amount of protein produced – any one will get your doe the same star. So, the * can be an indicator of a doe's performance in the AR.

A * can also be awarded based on the production in an observed one-day test, or based on owner-sampler testing. So, the * can be an indicator of a doe's performance in the **ST**.

Milk production is heritable. A * can also be awarded to a doe that has produced star-worthy offspring – for example, a doe that may not be a heavy producer could have three daughters that are given stars in the **AR**, and she herself would be awarded a *.

If a doe's dam earned a star, then the doe herself earned a star, then she gets a second star, or 2* in her pedigree. If her granddam also earned a star, then she'd have a 3*, and so on for however many continuous generations of star-level production.

Here's where different registries make life confusing. In an ADGA

pedigree, a star is shown as "*M" for "milker." In an AGS pedigree, a star is shown as "*D" for "doe."

Although it's difficult to milk bucks, they can be awarded stars. A * for a buck is based solely on the merits of his ancestors, rather than his own achievements. If a buckling is born to a * dam and a sire who has already sired some * does, he is born with a * to his name. (Ain't that they way it is – does have to produce either milk or better kids to get a star, but the bucks are born on third base thinking they've hit a triple!)

Bucks *can* get awards for their own efforts – if a buck sires three starworthy daughters, or has sons that sire lots of star-worthy daughters, he is awarded a +, and if he's really fruitful, two plusses.

Again, there is a difference between ADGA, where bucks are listed as *B or +B, and AGS, where they are noted as *S or +S.

Ultimately, pedigrees are like movies: more stars is better, but no guarantee of greatness.

IowaState**Fair**

Iowa State Fair Official One Day Milking Competition

August 17 at 7 pm, August 18 at 7 am, and August 18 at 7 pm

A milking test at the Iowa State Fair that is governed by ADGA rules! Milk samples will be sent to a lab along with weights to potentially earn does their milking stars!

It runs at the same time as the fair sponsored one so it starts Thursday at 7pm and there's two more milking at 7 am and 7pm on Friday. The entry fee is \$7 and it just covers the costs to ship the samples to the lab and sanction fees.

The One Day Milking Competition is a way to validate 24 hour production. The first milk out which will be from 7-8 PM is a start time in which the does will be checked to verify they are empty. Then there are two subsequent

milking to provide weights and take samples at 12 hour increments.

All does entered must be entered at check in prior to 7 pm using their complete registered name, registration number, date of birth, date of freshening and tattoo. Tattoos will be checked and illegible and/or missing tattoos will be disqualified.

Does will be milked in a designated area which will be the show arena.
