IDGA Open Linear Appraisal Session

Applications for 2014 sessions are now closed, but there will be a private session held in Grinnell, IA, on October 11 at 4pm. This will be a very small session with only Jasper Farm goats being appraised, but you are invited to come observe, and we hope this will be the foundation for future group IDGA Linear Appraisal sessions.

ADGA Linear Appraiser John White is scheduled to run the session. John White has raised goats for 30-plus years, both dairy and meat breeds, and has several times been a national show judge. At the 2013 ADGA National Convention, he presented a mini-workshop on evaluating type. And from personal experience, I can say that he is an excellent teacher!

This is a great chance to learn what a linear appraisal session is all about. If you love to go to shows and learn from the judge, a linear appraisal session is just like that but with so much more information, and very personalized.

With the timing of our region's 2014 Linear Appraisal sessions coming well into fall, many breeders chose to hold off on Linear Appraisal this year. Every year ADGA rotates the timing tho, so next year's session will come earlier in the season. This may be your start to join in on the session with your herd in 2015!

Should we end up holding our show in June that would help us get past the cooler weather and graduations. One other thing I'd like to ponder about our show is the fact of goats on Saturday that earn their Permanent championships, then return to the next sanctioned ring and are shown which may perhaps hinder another animal from getting it's championship. If I pull my animal that just earned its Permanent will the rest of that breed have enough animals to be sanctioned? These tend to be political questions we face. Exhibitors get frustrated and some people go home upset. I was asked by more than one exhibitor "what should they do"? Pull their animal or leave it? My general response is that ultimately it's not up to me... If we have enough to sanction the breed and can get by by pulling a new permanent champion then since our show is NOT a premium payer then perhaps we should pull the animal... Great question with many answers.

While at our show I stood back several times and enjoyed the peace of the event. Several new families were attending, they seemed to be well received and many of our founding fathers were taking them under their wing and helping with the newbie questions and guiding them through the day. It is refreshing to see these new faces. It is our reward to make sure these people get a positive experience. Just like you leading an animal into the ring, the first impression to the judge is the most important. So then it is with our new visitors to our show. If we as weathered show people bicker or whine, or act in such a fashion that miss represents us ethically or professionally then shame on us. Our IDGA membership is currently on an up rise. Let's keep the energy flowing through all the circuits.

Last but certainly not least a huge thank you to the McDaniel family, James and Jamie spent many personal hours preparing for this show, the supper served on Saturday night, and the long night involved cleaning after we're all home safely in bed.
