**OFFICIAL RULES OF THE DAIRY GOAT SHOW**

1. These shows are sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association (ADGA), and its rules shall govern. Nigerian Dwarf dairy goats are dual sanctioned with ADGA and the American Goat Society (AGS).

2. Show entries will be accepted starting May 1<sup>st</sup> 2026 through showman.app
3. There will be four (4) separately sanctioned shows for Junior Does, four (4) separately sanctioned shows for Senior Does, and two (2) separately sanctioned shows for Bucks.
  - The Senior Doe show is sanctioned for Saanen, Nigerian Dwarf, Recorded Grade, Nubian, Toggenburg, Alpine, LaMancha, Oberhasli, and All Other Purebreds.
  - The Junior Doe Show is sanctioned for Saanen, Nigerian Dwarf, Recorded Grade, Nubian, Toggenburg, Oberhasli, All Other Purebred, Alpine, and LaMancha.
  - The Buck show is sanctioned for Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, and All Other Purebred.
4. **Saturday, June 6, 2026:** Rings 1 and 2 of the Senior Doe show will be held simultaneously beginning at 8:00am. This will be immediately followed by Rings 1 and 2 of the Junior Doe show. Rings 3 and 4 of the Junior Doe Show will follow immediately after Rings 1 and 2 have been completed. Judges and Secretaries will switch rings after both breeds have been completed. Each breed will stay in the ring location and the judges and secretaries will move from ring to ring.  
**Sunday, June 8, 2026:** The show will start at 8am with Showmanship. Rings 3 and 4 Senior Does will start simultaneously after showmanship. Rings 1 and 2 of the Buck show will follow immediately after the Senior Doe show.
5. THE SHOW ORDER IS SUBJECT TO CHANGE BASED ON THE NUMBER OF ENTRIES IN EACH BREED.
6. Papers will be checked and the Official Show Report signed before the judge begins judging another breed.
7. All animals must be individually identified on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and originate from herds or areas not under quarantine. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection for goats will require clinical inspection by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days prior to date of entry to exhibition grounds. All sexually intact goats must be identified with an individual Scrapie Flock of Origin Identification tag or by an official tattoo registered with the USDA (to register, call 1-866-USDA-TAG), and the complete ear tag number or complete ear and/or tail web tattoo number must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. If you use tattoos instead of scrapie tags, complete numbers from both ears (complete tail or flank numbers) must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.  
A statement must be include on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection indicating that the herd participates in the scrapie program, and listing the official tattoo registered to the herd.  
Any evidence of club lamb fungus, ringworm, draining abscesses, foot rot, sore mouth, or any other contagious disease will eliminate the animal from the show.  
Goats originating from outside of the state exhibiting and/or transported along to be considered for sale at the exhibition must originate from a state-certified brucellosis free herd, or the animal(s) exhibited must have a negative brucellosis test performed within 90 days of the exhibition. In addition, they must originate from a herd having a whole-herd negative Tuberculosis test within the last twelve months, or the animal(s) exhibited and/or brought along must have a record of a negative Tuberculosis test performed within 90 days of exhibition. Brucellosis and Tuberculosis class “free” state status for bovines is not recognized for goats moving into Iowa. Goats originating from outside the state exhibiting and returning to the premises of origin are exempt from testing requirements, with the following statement written by the licensed accredited veterinarian on the

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection: “The goat(s) listed are for exhibition only and not for resale.”

8. In the event of a question as to the health of an animal, a veterinarian will be called at the owner’s expense.
9. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed, equipment (including milk stand). Bedding of wood shavings will be available for PREORDER at \$9/bale. Only wood shavings are acceptable bedding **NO STRAW ALLOWED.**
- 10. NO FULL BODY CLIPPING WILL BE ALLOWED ON FAIRGROUNDS.**
11. Exhibitors must clean out their pens before being released. Waste must be placed in the provided dumpsters. Please have a member of the show committee check your pens before you leave.
12. All registration papers will be checked upon arrival or at a time to be announced.
13. Each owner/exhibitor with an individual registering association ID number shall submit a separate entry form.
14. All animals exhibited must be tattooed and registered with a recognized Registering Association. Owners must provide the reader for microchips used as supplemental identification.
15. The original registration certificate is required for all animals 6 months of age or older. Animals under 6 months of age may show with a stamped duplicate Application for Registration. Signed transfers will not be accepted as proof of ownership.
16. Early Bird Discount (postmarked by 5/31/2026): \$6 pen fee, \$5 per head one ring, \$10 per head two rings, \$15 per head 3 rings, and \$20 per head four rings. **TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR EARLY BIRD DISCOUNT, PAYMENT MUST BE INCLUDED WITH ENTRY EITHER BY CHECK OR THROUGH THE SHOWMAN APP.**  
Regular Fees (after 5/31/2026): \$8 pen fee, \$7 per head one ring, \$14 per head two rings, \$21 per head three rings, and \$28 per head four rings.
17. The pen fee is per pen; pens should hold 4 standard adults comfortably. **Only goats entered in the show may be penned unless authorized by Show Chairman in advance.**
18. Animals should arrive no earlier than 1:00 pm Friday, June 5<sup>th</sup> 2026. Check in for Saturday, June 6<sup>th</sup> or all four rings will be 1PM-12A on Friday, June 5<sup>th</sup> and 6A-7A Saturday, June 6<sup>th</sup>. Check in for Sunday June 7<sup>th</sup> will be from 8AM-end of show on Saturday, June 6<sup>th</sup> or 6AM-7AM Sunday June 7<sup>th</sup>.
19. There will not be a pre-show milk-out.
20. The base date for computing age will be June 6<sup>th</sup>, 2026.
21. As a courtesy to others, permanent champions are asked to be shown in the Champion Challenge class only. There will be champion challenge in the buck shows.
22. Iowa Dairy Goat Association and Jasper County Fair Association will not be responsible for accidents, damages, or losses.
23. Exhibitors are expected to display courteous behavior. Unsportsmanlike conduct may result in loss of entry fees and expulsion from the show if deemed necessary by the show committee.
24. A food table will be available on site to purchase breakfast and lunch both days. Saturday evening, IDGA will provide a meal for all exhibitors.
